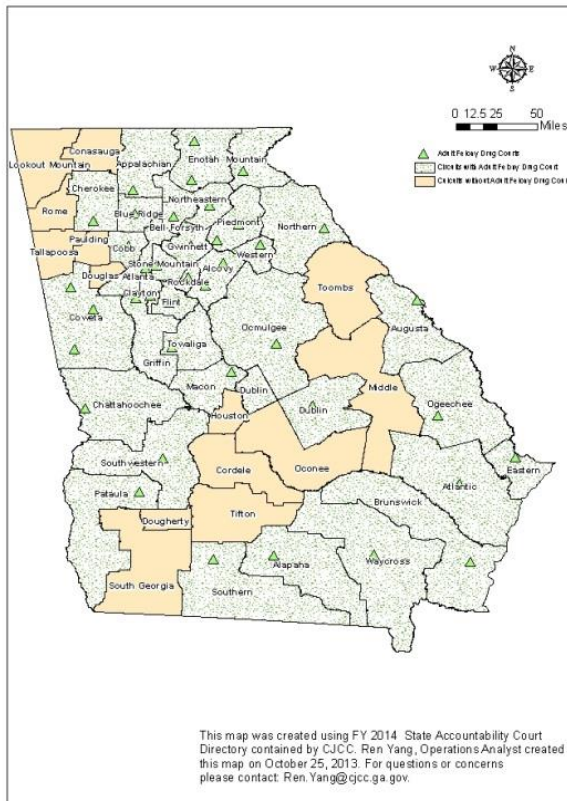

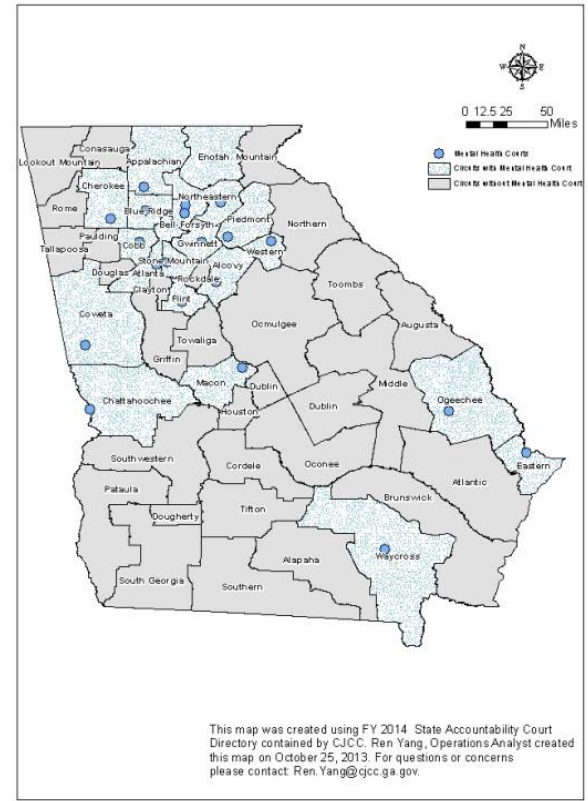

Adult Felony Drug & Mental Health Court (cont'd)

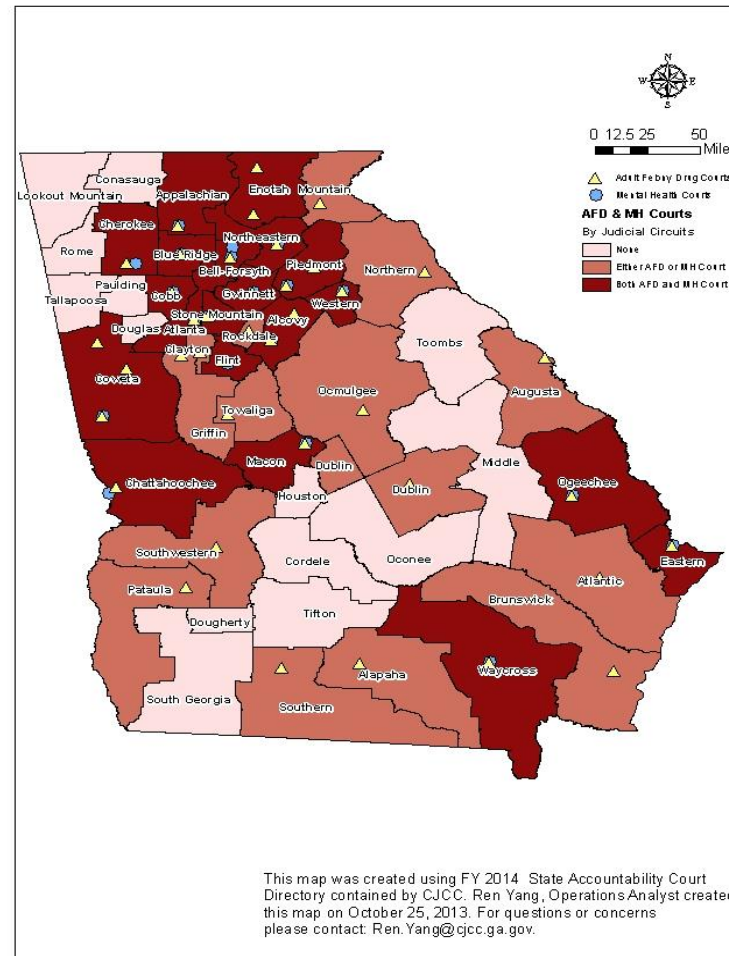
Of the 49 Judicial Circuits in the State of Georgia, 35 have at least one state-funded Adult Felony Drug Court, and 20 have at least one state-funded Mental Health Court.

14 Judicial Circuits have **no** Adult Felony Drug or Mental Health Courts in their area.

15 Judicial Circuits have either a Adult Felony Drug or a Mental Health Court in their area.

20 Judicial Circuits have **both** Adult Felony Drug and Mental Health Courts in their area.

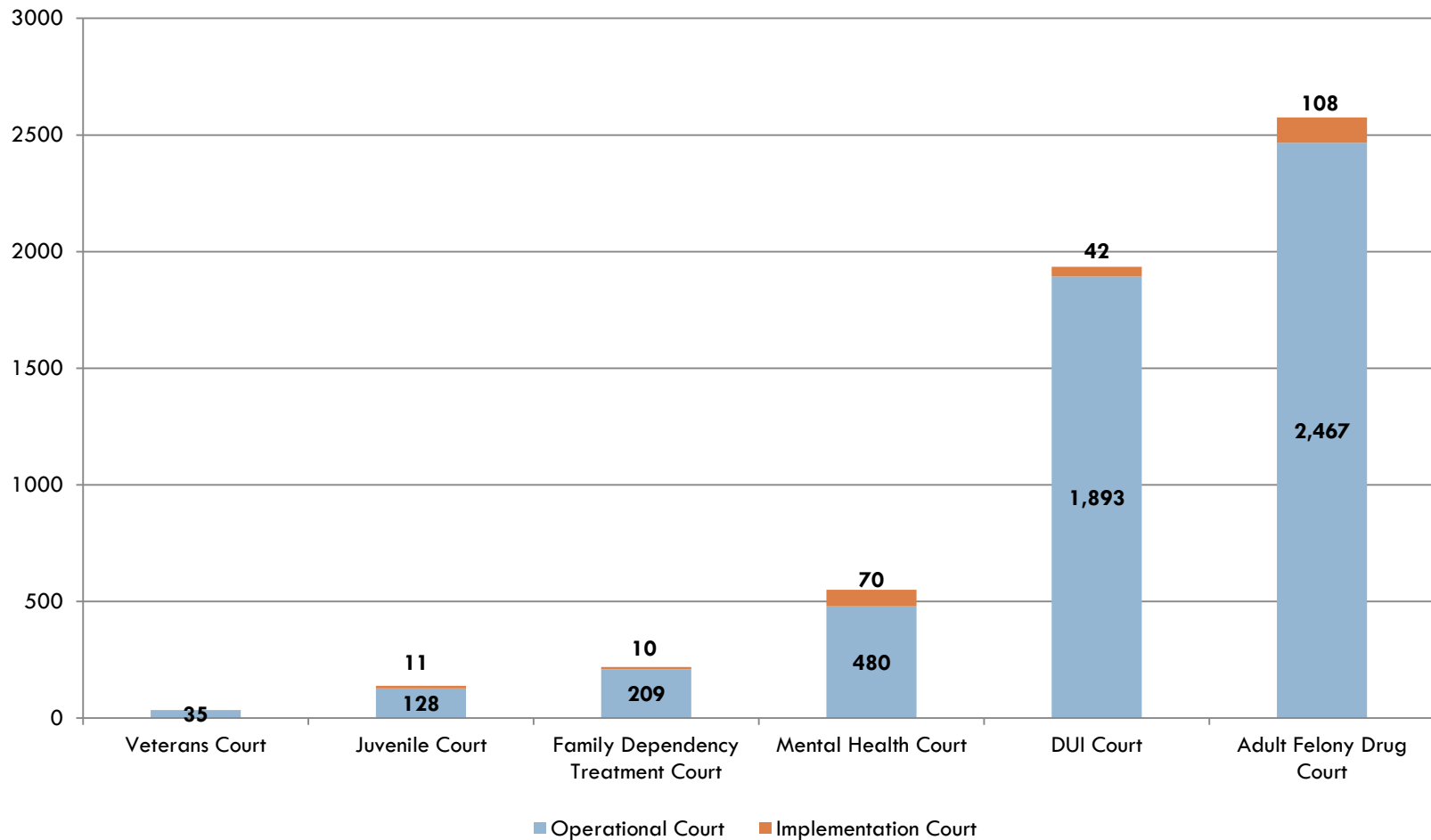

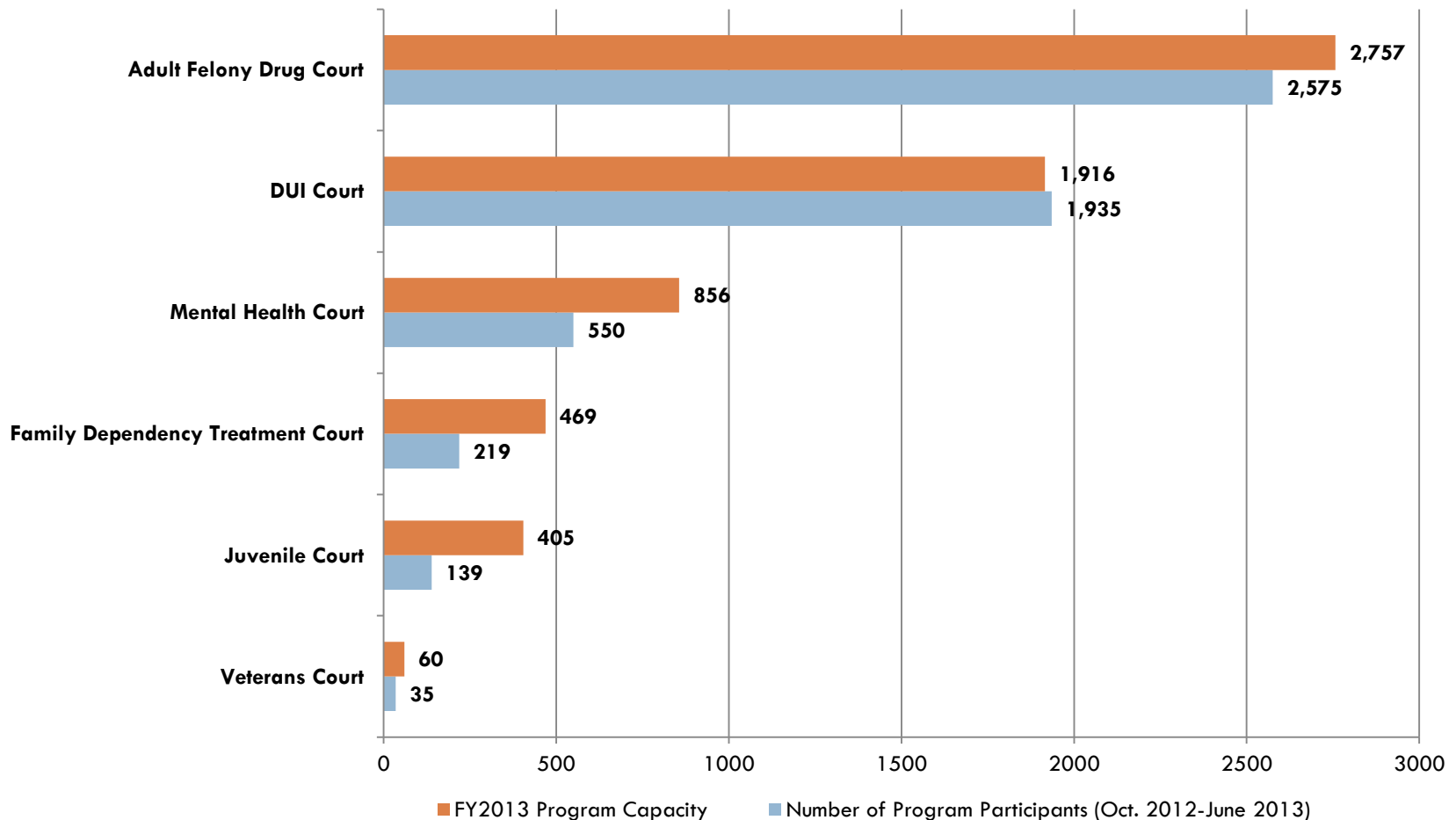
Active Program Participants By Court Type

 - Bus Token/MARTA Card for Program Participants

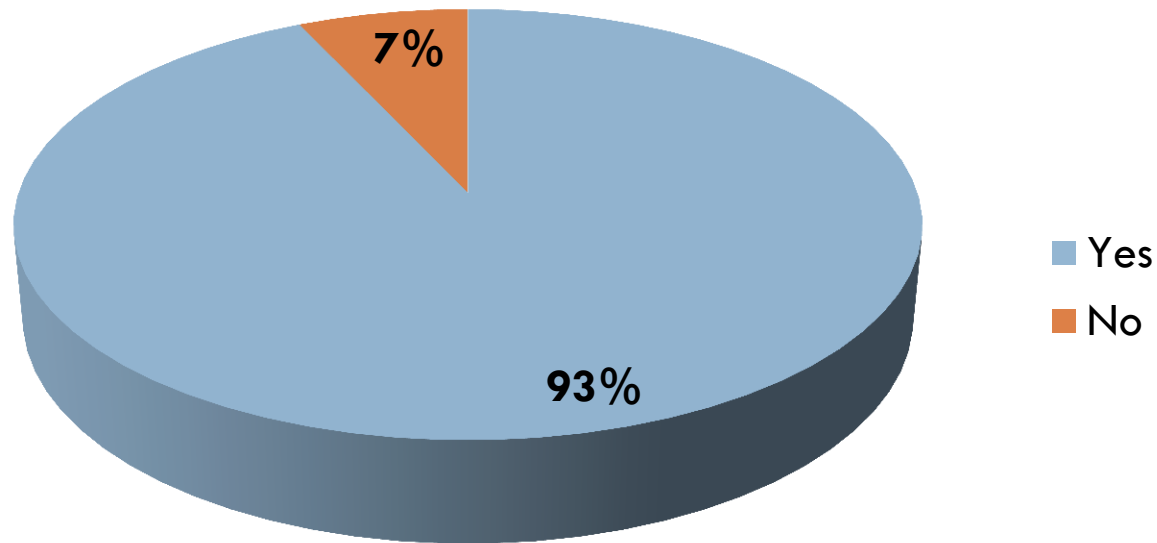

Training

- How often do accountability courts attend training beyond that which the Accountability Court Funding Committee and CJCC provided?
 - ▣ 39% of courts do not attend additional training besides what is provided by the Accountability Court Funding Committee and CJCC
 - ▣ 38% of courts attend additional training at least annually
 - ▣ 23% of courts attend additional training more frequently, including semi-annually, and quarterly

- Does the court have plans to send core members to training on an annual basis?

Additional Necessary Training

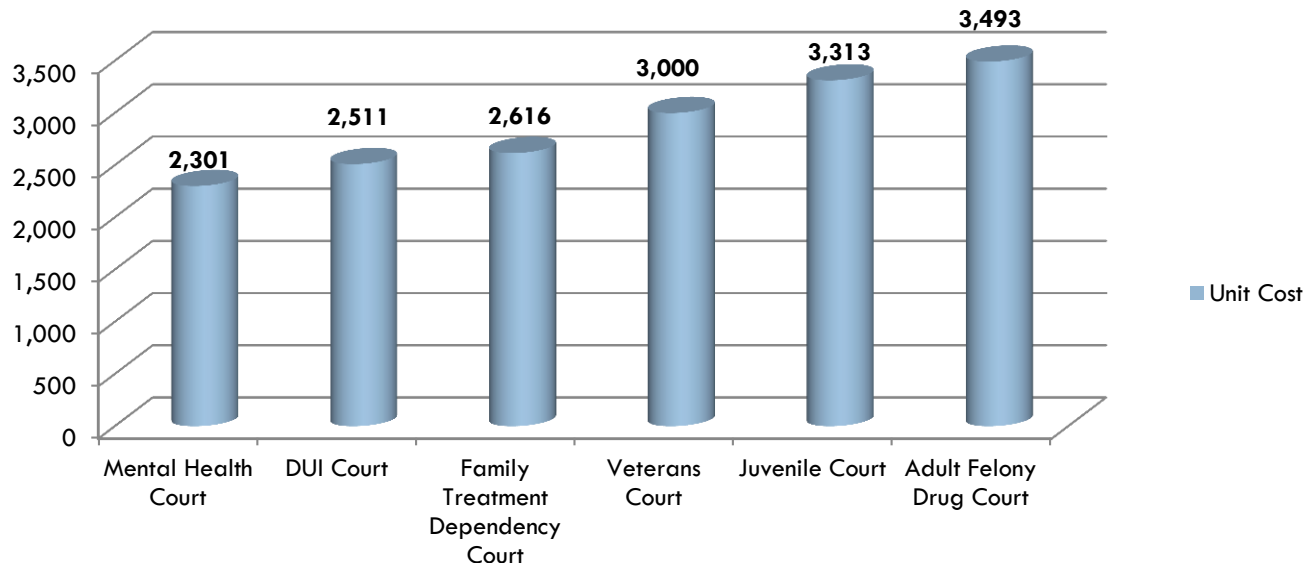
- Any training program that is not mandatory but would be beneficial to attend?
 - ▣ Improving Court Outcomes from Individuals with Co-Occurring Disorders (43.0%)
 - ▣ Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (23.2%)
 - ▣ Moral Reconciliation Therapy (20.5%)
 - ▣ Level of Service Inventory-Revised Training (18.5%)
 - ▣ No Additional Training Needed (16.6%)

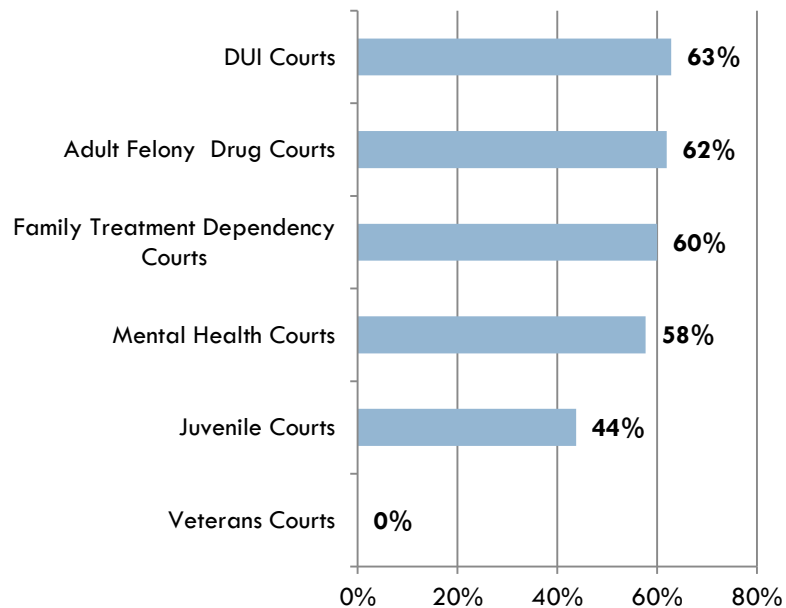

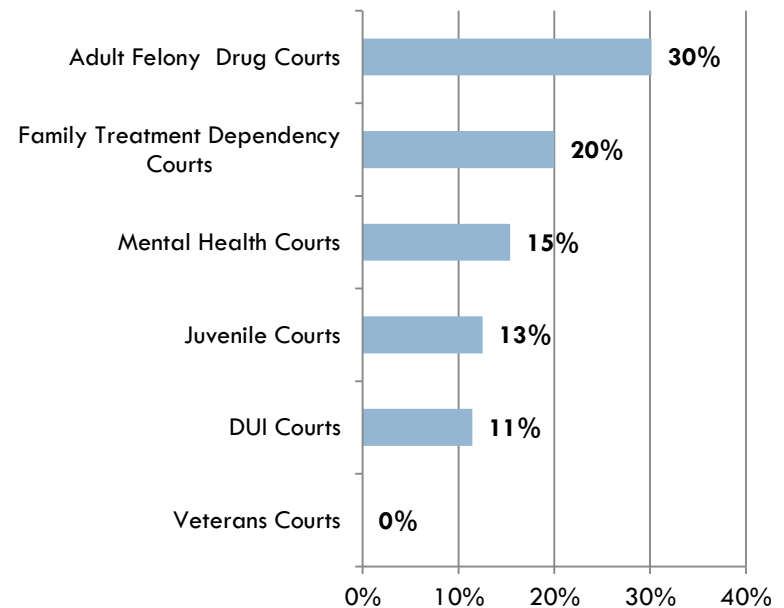
County Funds

Percentage of Accountability Courts Receiving Federal Funds

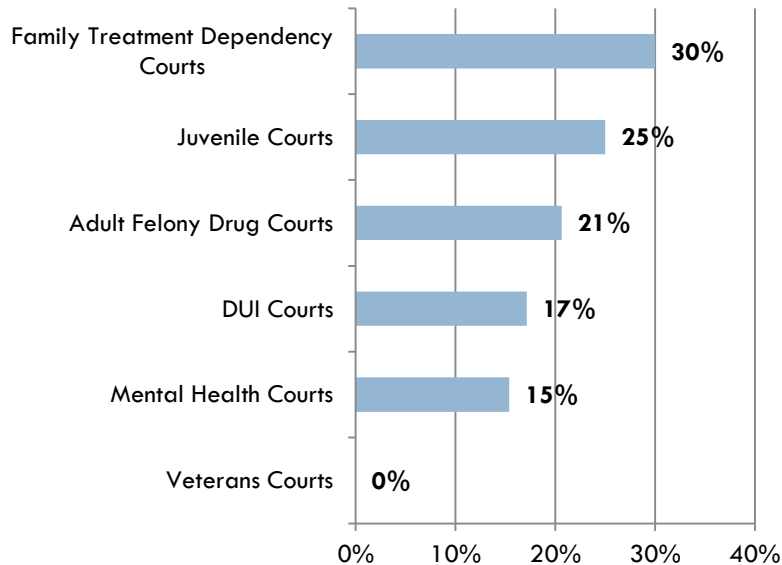

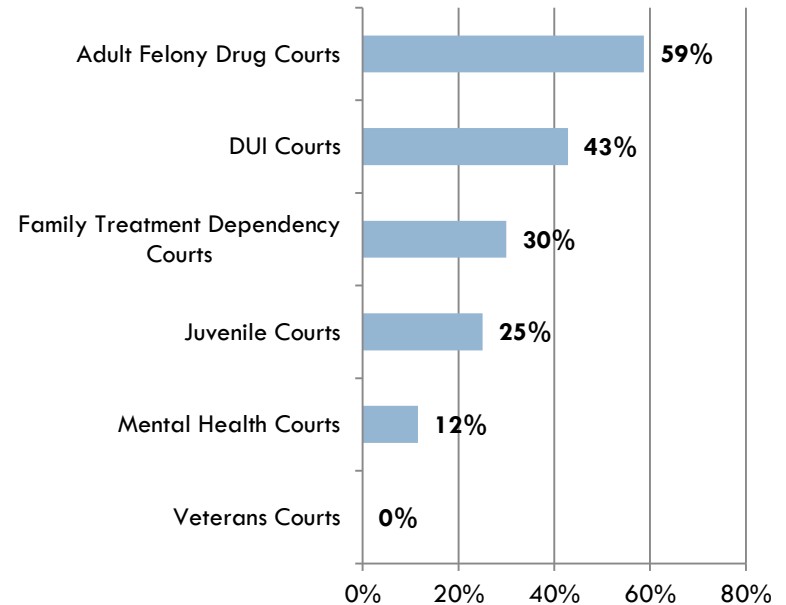

Transportation

- During Oct.1, 2012 to June 30, 2013 , **1,673** of the program participants served by accountability courts **did not** have reliable transportation. (**31%** of the participant population)
- About 36% of all accountability courts assist their participants who have transportation issues in a variety of ways.
- The most common ways are gas cards (37%), public transportation passes (37%), or referrals to other public provided transportation (32%).
- Courts are able to assist with transportation issues with the help of State Accountability Courts Grant, county funds, federal grant funds, private/non-profit funds, and other funding sources.

Substance Abuse Treatment Providers

- Community Service Board (42%)
- Nonprofit Provider (31%)
- Private Rehabilitation Facility (25%)

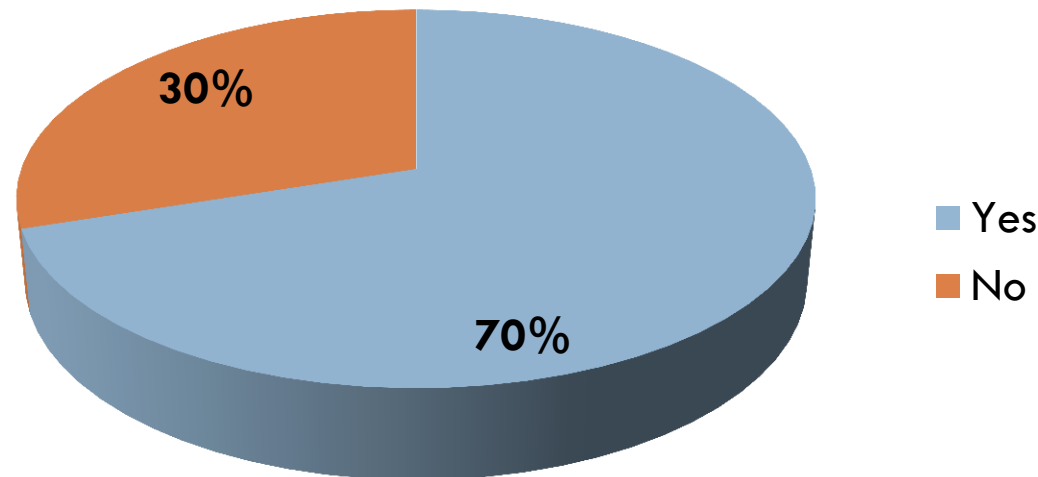
Community Service Board

- 66% of courts reported partnering with local community service board for treatment **other than** substance abuse.
- Over 75% courts do not pay for these services.

Case Management System

- Almost 70% of the courts have an electronic case management system (a database system, not including an Excel spreadsheet, that allows the court to manage all aspects of a client's involvement.)



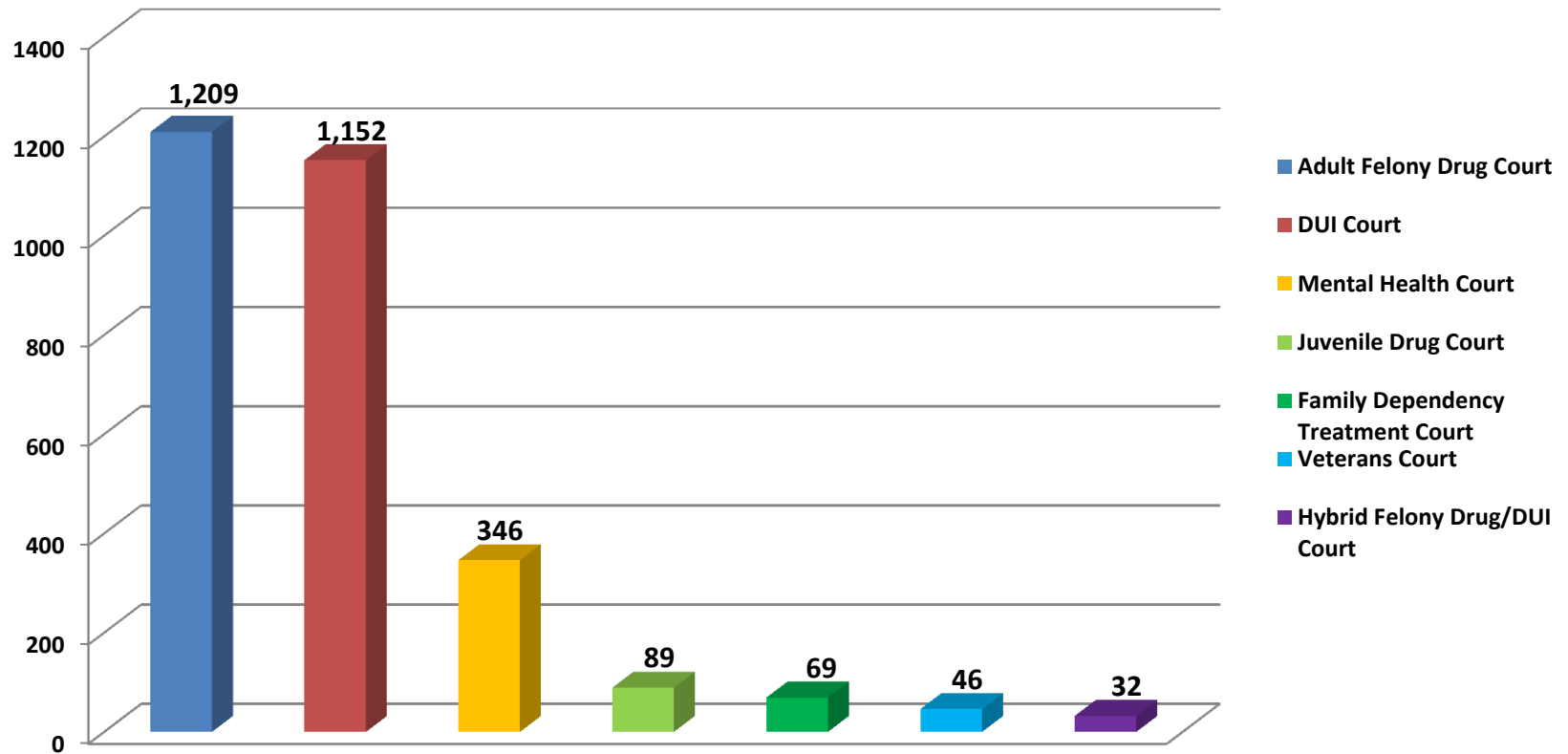

SID Reports Data (Oct. 2012 - June 2013)

- During SFY2013, CJCC funded 99 accountability courts across the state. Funded Courts were required to collect new offenders' demographic information and report back to CJCC monthly. By June 30th, 2013, 2,943 new offenders were committed into these courts.

(Oct. 2012 - June 2013)



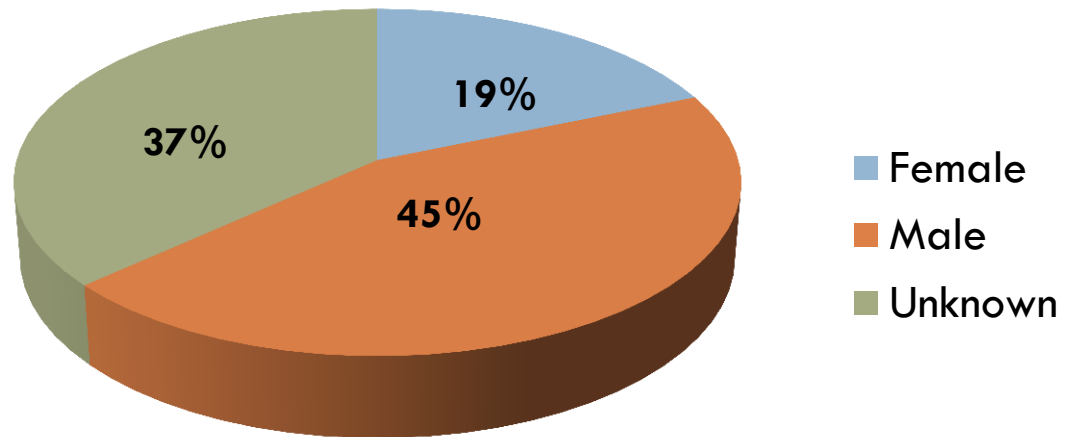

Gender

Despite the 1,079 new offenders that we do not know their gender, 45% of the new offenders are male and 19% are female.

(Oct. 2012 to June 2013)



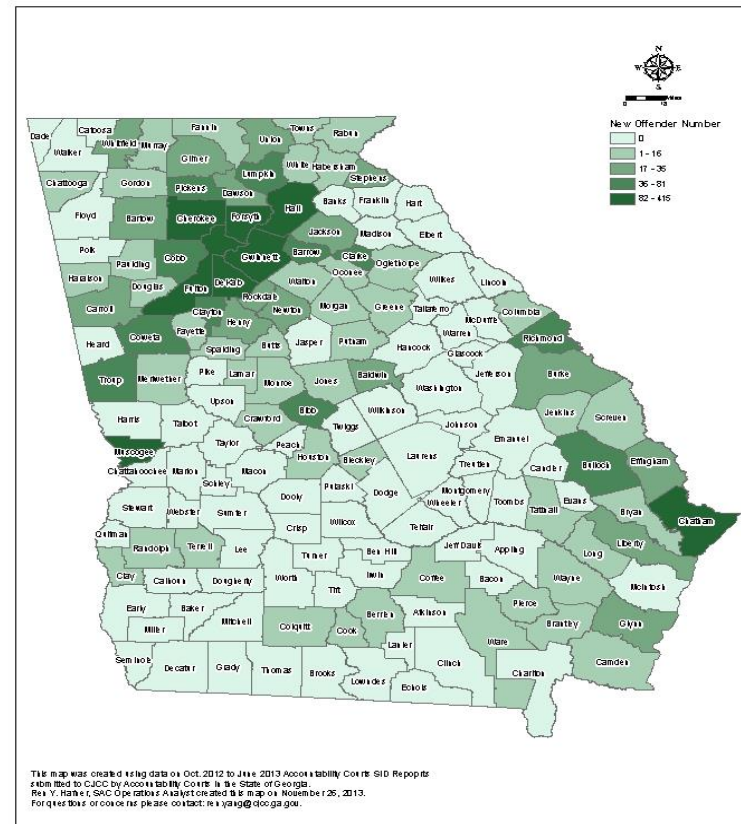

County of Residence

The map displays the number of new offenders served according to the offenders' county of residence. The majority of new offenders being served by state accountability courts originate from metro areas and eastern coastal areas. State accountability courts have served the most offenders from counties of Chatham (415), Fulton (221), Cherokee (167), Gwinnett (166), Forsyth (165), Hall (158), DeKalb (154) and Muscogee (138).
