# Innovating Criminal Justice

**\$19M** provided in state and federal grant funding for

**149** Accountability Courts statewide

**103**

Georgia jails visited for Juvenile Detention Compliance Monitoring

**24%**

increase in new Accountability Court participants compared to SFY 2016

**9,771**

active Accountability Court participants of which **4,029** were new

**1,465 juveniles**

were served in evidence-based programs

In SFY 2017,

CJCC-funded Drug Task Forces reported a

**77% increase**

in drugs seized from 2015 to 2016

**5,225**

professionals across a variety of disciplines were trained on best practices for working with domestic violence, sexual assault, and/or stalking victims

In SFY 2017, CJCC-funded sites entered an additional **3,780** gang member profiles into the state Gang Intelligence Platform, which resulted in a **342%** increase in profile matches

almost **25%** of those trained were law enforcement officers

CJCC-funded specialized prosecution units tried **3,890**

domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking cases

**61%**

of those resulted in convictions

Overall, the number of claims to the Crime Victims Compensation Program is up








For every dollar invested in administrative operations, CJCC puts **\$112** to work in the state of Georgia.




## CJCC Major Program Areas




For every dollar spent innovating criminal justice, CJCC distributed **\$1.80** to empower victims.


## Federal and State Investments in the Criminal Justice System
