
- This PowerPoint serves as a guide to the Local Victim Assistance Fines Annual Agency and Recertification Report. This report **MUST** be completed by any agency that wishes to apply for CJCC funding (i.e. VOCA, VAWA, etc.) and/or receive Local Victim Assistance Funds (5% Fines) from local counties.
- If you have already received victim assistance funding from CJCC you **MUST** complete this report as a grant requirement
- Currently certified agencies will remain in good standing through April 20th, 2022
- Agency certification occurs on a rolling basis. If you are new to certification, no matter what year, you will need to fill this out. If you are already a certified agency, you will complete this report on **even** numbered years. On **odd** numbered years, certified agencies will receive an e-mail to complete the annual agency report, which is just the first portion of this report.
- Currently certified agencies will remain in good standing through April 20th, 2022
- This report includes two parts:
 - 1) To report how much, if any, Local Victim Assistance Funds (5% Fines) an agency received in the previous calendar year and the usage of those funds. Slides 3-12 are the first portion of this report.
 - 2) To apply for certification (for new agencies) or recertification (for current certified agencies). Slides 13-29 are the second portion of this report.
- If you are a new agency that wants to become certified AND did **not** receive any 5% fines in the last calendar year, you can skip the first portion and go straight to the second portion. If, for some reason, an agency is not certified and receives 5% fines from a county, the agency **must** complete both portions of the report.
- Slide three includes directions on how to proceed directly to the second portion. Slides numbers are identified in the bottom




