Introduction

Georgia's Statewide Human Trafficking Task Force Work Group One (WG1) has been responsible for Community Awareness and Education since the task force's inception. Initially, WG1 focused its efforts on Georgia's hotel industry by providing hotels with resources and materials to help them maintain compliance with state laws mandating that hotels post the national human trafficking hotline number on their premises. In addition, WG1 developed industry-specific human trafficking prevention training for hotels to better equip hotel management and front-of-house and back-of-house staff to identify and prevent trafficking within their hotel. In 2020, WG1 shifted its focus to other industries and began researching what human trafficking prevention and awareness training opportunities were available. As a result, WG1 compiled the information into the Human Trafficking Training compendium that is meant to connect professionals and individuals in the community to available human trafficking prevention and awareness training that is specific to their industry and/or needs. Through this process, WG1 added the Faith-Based community to its focus, as a need was identified on how to better equip faith communities, leaders, and advocates with the knowledge and tools needed to recognize, prevent, and respond to human trafficking.

In 2022, WG1 began researching various Faith-Based focused human trafficking prevention and awareness training opportunities that are available, virtual and in-person. Various trainings will provide Faith-Based organizations with a comprehensive understanding of the issue, explore its impact on individuals and communities, and offer practical strategies for intervention and support. As a result, WG1 compiled the information into the following resource, "Faith-based Human Trafficking Training Compendium", that is meant to connect professionals and individuals in the community to available human trafficking prevention and awareness training that is specific to their Faith's organization and/ or needs.

It should be noted that WG1 members have evaluated these programs based on publicly available information, interviews with program providers, and in some cases, personal experience with these training programs. This list is not exhaustive, and though the WG does not endorse a particular program, each program has been vetted and is considered to be high quality and accessible to the public.



Training for All Faiths (No Cost)

The trainings in this section are excellent choices for all faith-based organizations and individuals. They provide a comprehensive overview of human trafficking, making them valuable for clergy, faith-based leaders, members, and staff who seek a deeper understanding of this critical issue.
