Didactic Program Overview

This program is designed for nurses or other medical personnel who are interested in providing forensic-medical assessments and care to pediatric victims of sexual assault. The 40-hour didactic portion is conducted over a 5 (8 hr) day period and attendance for the entire training is required to receive continuing education credit hours.
