DESCRIPTION:

This full-day program will discuss the crime of alcohol and drugfacilitated sexual assault (AFSA/DFSA) and its impact on victims, law enforcement, toxicology laboratories, and society. The challenges of this crime include drugs used, the reporting of the crime, proper evidence collection, and the toxicological analyses of specimens. The challenge associated with strong, central nervous system depressants used to commit DFSA emphasizes their pharmacological effects and how these drugs create difficulties in the investigation.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Describe the media's role in establishing myths about drugfacilitated crimes
- 2. List the three major challenges encountered in alcohol and drugfacilitated sexual assault investigations
- 3. Categorize the most common drugs associated with drug-facilitated crimes and compare and contrast their pharmacological effects
- 4. Recognize at least three "obscure" drugs associated with drugfacilitated crimes and reflect upon why they are used
- 5. Describe how to overcome some of the challenges of drug-facilitated crimes to improve the SART response.
